The overhaul integrates more closely with NPR—from streamlined content sharing to enhanced web analytics.


The new KJZZ.org includes an always-on live-streaming audio player—the large orange play button on the


This new, easy-to-use app is available in the App Store and on Google Play.

Murrow Awards put public interest above all else, provide a catalyst for public discussion, and adhere to the Radio Television Digital News Association (RTDNA) Code of Ethics. KJZZ won four **Regional Murrow Awards** for news coverage in 2023 in the following areas:

- Sports Reporting: Girls Flag Football is Off to a Flying Start with First Arizona Championship this Year by Phil Latzman












KJZZ also won three **Public Media Journalists Association awards** recognizing the best of local public radio news:

- Use of Sound, first place: Cheap and welcoming, Hermosillo's Club Obregon is where the city hangs out with itself by Murphy Woodhouse














A Message from the Executive Director

Reaching New Listeners

Sun Sounds of Arizona, with affiliates in Flagstaff, Tempe, and Tucson, is committed to community outreach and making as many people as possible aware of our lifeenhancing reading service.

In fiscal year 2023–2024, our volunteers and outreach coordinator stepped out at 300 events across the state, including the Aging Made Easier Conference in Chandler, the 13th Annual African American Conference on Disabilities, and many more.

Sun Sounds ambassadors also presented at senior communities like Westminster Village in North Scottsdale and hosted groups for tours of our studios to help them better understand our volunteer-fueled operation.

Sun Sounds continues to serve the community with audio versions of printed election information, enabling those with vision or reading disabilities to gain the knowledge needed to be informed voters.





Expanding Our Impact at Local Schools

SPOT 127 Youth Media Center provides young people in the greater Phoenix area with mentoring and instruction in key digital skills vital for success in today's information economy.

Your gifts of support help SPOT 127's instructors step out into the community and visit schools, offering students the time and resources needed to enhance their multimedia abilities.

We appreciate our Tax Credit Donors! In FY 23-24, we received \$69,339.33






Fiscal Year 2023–2024 Financials

End of Year Assets: \$10,640,702


Membership as of 6/30/24:
